Description of course

Welcome to your Policing or Uniformed Public Services Course. As part of your course preparation, you are required to undertake a series of activities and tasks. These activities and tasks are designed to help you get an understanding of the course content and the preentry requirements for the Police and your chosen career in the Uniformed Public Services as well as allowing you to show case your talents.

<u>Course Aim</u>

Both courses have 5 primary aims:

1. To help students prepare for a career in the Police or a Uniformed Public Services of their choice.

2. To allow students to explore the different career options in the Police or Uniformed Public Service that are available to them.
