In line with DFE Guidance: Careers guidance and access for education and training providers January 2023; The college CEIAG Programme provides opportunities for students at the start of college and in transitioning out of college to:

- Receive Information about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities throughout the admissions, enrolment and/or progression process
- Have a full range of education and training options available at each transition point and suitable to their individual needs
- Attend events with access to a range of Post-16, Higher Education, Training /Apprenticeship opportunities (Local and National) For example: UCAS HE Conventions, virtual/online events/workshops, employer visits/open days and visiting speakers, as well as provider literature and website information links.
- To be supported in making well informed career decisions through the College's enrolment and progression process, and to understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses, employment, training and apprenticeship opportunities open to them. The College uses the GMACS platform and Xello careers tool to support students in accessing a range of career opportunities
- Have access impartial support from their Progress Tutor or a member of the Careers Team (the latter being professionally qualified to Level 6)
