

QUALIFICATION NAME

LEVEL 2 APPRENTICESHIP – SITE CARPENTRY

AREAS COVERED

- Carry out a range of site carpentry work to either domestic or commercial buildings
- First fix work to include fitting stud partitioning work, windows and door frames, door or hatch linings, staircases and floor joint coverings
- Second fix work to include fitting internal and external doors and ironmongery, wall and floor units, skirting and architrave, stair components, boxing in services and cladding
- Erecting traditional and truss roofs, verge and eaves finishes, floor and flat roof joists and decking
- Repair and replacement work to existing properties to include door and window frames, glazing, mouldings, doors, ironmongery, verge and eaves finishes, guttering and downpipes and sash cords

COURSE CONTENT

- During day release at college, apprentices will study theory work as well as practical work
- Apprentices will learn to understand and interpret site management technical information including drawings, specifications and schedules
- Apprentices will also complete an **End Point Assessment (EPA)** in the form of a written theory exam and practical skills assessment
- Training must include **20% off the job training**, which is undertaken outside of the normal day-to-day working environment and leads towards the achievement of an apprenticeship. This can include training that is delivered at the apprentice's normal place of work, but must not be delivered as part of their normal working duties
- Apprentices will also achieve level 1 or 2 functional skills in maths and English, if required

DURATION / COURSE FORMAT

- The apprenticeship takes 24 months to complete
- The apprentice will complete the qualification in the workplace as well as attending college 1 day per week

LEVEL 3 ADVANCED APPRENTICESHIP – SITE CARPENTRY

AREAS COVERED

- Carry out a range of site carpentry work to either domestic or commercial buildings
- First fix work to include fitting stud partitioning work (with change of direction and door openings), bespoke windows and door frames, shaped linings and staircases with change of direction
- Second fix work to include fitting double doors and ironmongery, bespoke kitchens, patterned skirting and architrave, stair components and accessible service encasement
- Install bespoke structural and complex traditional and truss roof work to include hips, valleys, dormers and eaves finishes
- Repair and replacement work to existing properties (to include general and structural repair and replacement work)

COURSE CONTENT

- During day release at college, apprentices will study theory work as well as practical work
- Apprentices will learn to understand and interpret site management technical information including drawings, specifications and schedules
- Apprentices will also complete an **End Point Assessment (EPA)** in the form of a written theory exam and practical skills assessment
- Training must include **20% off the job training**, which is undertaken outside of the normal day-to-day working environment and leads towards the achievement of an apprenticeship. This can include training that is delivered at the apprentice's normal place of work, but must not be delivered as part of their normal working duties
- Apprentices will also achieve level 2 functional skills in maths and English, if required

DURATION / COURSE FORMAT

- The apprenticeship takes 15 months to complete
- The apprentice will complete the qualification in the workplace as well as attending college 1 day per week
